The Better Cotton Initiative (BCI) is a multistakeholder Standards System set up to make global cotton production better for the people who produce it, better for the environment it grows in and better for the sector's future. The Better Cotton Standard System is an innovative and constantlyevolving system that is designed for scale and impact.

There are currently 1.5 million licensed BCI Farmers and over 1000 BCI Members from across the cotton sector working together to promote



measurable and continuing improvements for the environment, farming communities and the economies of cotton-producing areas. This role offers you the opportunity to join an enthusiastic and dynamic team that are making significant global changes.

As Senior Supply Chain Coordinator, you will be supporting the Senior Assurance Manager on overseeing BCl's supply chain program to ensure it remains credible and fit-for-purpose. BCl's supply chain program uses a mass-balance approach to enable 'Better Cotton' produced by licensed BCl farmers to flow through the supply chain, connecting retailer sourcing commitments with real improvements at farm level.

Approximately 60% of your time will be focused on supply chain compliance, which involves helping to set up and coordinate supply chain auditing, monitoring, and verification activities. This work will mainly be focused on BCI supply chains and country teams in India, Pakistan, China, and Turkey. Your role will involve regular interactions with BCI staff, auditors, and textile supply chain actors globally to provide operational support and develop programme improvements. The role also involves managing and analysing supply chain data collected in the BCI's online traceability tool (the Better Cotton Tracer).

For the remaining 40% of your time, you will help coordinate seasonal farm level Better Cotton Assurance Program activities, and contribute to maintaining, enhancing and reviewing the program to ensure its effectiveness. You will help to update and improve assurance procedures, conduct internal monitoring of assurance implementation, and facilitate external oversight activities. You will also help contribute to capacity building with the development and delivery of training activities.

You will report to BCI's Senior Assurance Manager, work closely with the other members of the Supply Chain and Standards & Assurance teams, and liaise with members of the Global Supply Programme Team across 4 continents.

You will be available for periodic travel to the countries under your remit (approximately 2-3 weeks per year long haul travel and 3-6 short-haul trips within Europe). Countries which currently implement the Better Cotton Standard System include: China, India, Pakistan, Israel, Kazakhstan, Madagascar, Mali, Mozambique, Senegal, South Africa, Tajikistan, Turkey, and

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USA. We also have partnerships to recognise qualified cotton from Australia, Brazil and countries within the Aid by Trade Foundation Standard System.

This challenging role offers excellent opportunities for personal and professional development, international travel together with a competitive benefits package.

Better Cotton Chain of Custody (15%)

- 1. Support the revision and regular updating of the Better Cotton Chain of Custody Guidelines according to the changing membership and traceability requirements
- 2. Develop and update supply chain communication and training materials
- 3. Support the process for supply chain integrity risk mapping and mitigation

Supply Chain Monitoring (15%)

- 4. Support the development of improved supply chain monitoring and audit processes, including clear protocols and templates
- 5. Coordinate the development and execution of a global plan for monitoring visits along BCI supply chains
- 6. Coordinate with BCI country teams to ensure supply chain compliance activities are carried out on schedule
- 7. Prepare reports about supply chain compliance and share key findings with internal and external stakeholders
- 8. Support the process for contracting with third party auditors to carry out supply chain audits

Data Integrity - Better Cotton Tracer (30%)

- 9. Provide support for the BCI's supply chain compliance strategy related to the entries made in the Better Cotton Tracer
- 10. Analyse data from the Better Cotton Tracer to identify key risk areas or anomalies; assist in designing compliance reports
- 11. Review transactions entered into the BCI's traceability system regularly to ensure compliance and address non-conformities
- 12. Support the overall use and development of the Better Cotton Tracer system

Support farm-level assurance and monitoring (40%)

- 13. Coordinate with country teams to ensure farm-level assurance activities (e.g. self-assessment, second and third-party audits) are carried out on schedule and according to internal protocols
- 14. Support the development and execution of regional assurance plans and timelines for participating BCI countries
- 15. Update and enhance the existing tools, templates, and policies supporting and governing the farm-level Assurance Program; develop new components as required
- 16. Monitor assurance data in the BCI Online Project Database for assigned countries.
- 17. Monitor field-level compliance outcomes and produce annual summary reports for assigned countries.
- 18. Support the development and delivery of training on BCI's assurance program for internal and external audiences

The position is full time (40 hours a week) and based in our offices in London. Location in the BCI Geneva office is also possible for the right candidate.
