Background

Pakistan is the 5th largest cotton producer in the world. Better Cotton has been grown in Pakistan since 2009. Today, Pakistan is the 2nd largest producer of Better Cotton, with close to 500,000 licensed farmers, across the provinces of Punjab and Sindh. In addition, more than 180,000 workers are reported as employed by farmers, ranging from permanent or seasonal workers, to piece-rate or daily workers.

In line with Better Cotton's mission to support cotton communities to survive and thrive, Decent Work is one of 7 core principles of our farm-level standard. It is covered under Better Cotton's <u>Principles &</u> <u>Criteria</u>, which applies to farmers and workers participating in Better Cotton programmes worldwide. Within our Decent Work Principle, specifications support the promotion of the ILO's Fundamental Principles & Rights at Work on Better Cotton farms, which our criteria draws on. This includes:

- Freedom of association and the right to collective bargaining;
- Eliminating all forms of forced or compulsory labour;
- Eliminating child labour;
- Eliminating discrimination
- Promoting a safe and healthy working environment

The Better Cotton standard also promotes decent working conditions in line with local regulation and collective agreements, including on wages and working arrangements. Better Cotton and its partners continuously provide crucial guidance and support to farming communities on the implementation of our standard.

In recent years, a global Taskforce on Decent Work was established by Better Cotton to support the organization in strengthening its risk management, monitoring, identification and remediation approach with regards to potential labour and human rights risks. Recognizing that access to remedy is a core part of any approach to address potentially adverse human rights impacts in cotton production and fundamental to the promotion of decent work, one of the key recommendations made by the Taskforce was for Better Cotton "to update and expand" its existing organizational-level grievance mechanism, and remediation approach.

Therefore, as we look to transform and update our remediation strategy:

We are seeking to understand what state-based and non-state based, judicial and non-judicial grievance and remedy mechanisms currently exist in Pakistan, through which – in case of incidence – access to remedy by Better Cotton farmers, workers and impacted communities, could be sought, and which, could be considered compliant with UNGP criteria.

We are also particularly keen to identify what intermediaries (NGOs, Trade Unions or other worker and community organizations) may be supporting individuals in accessing remedy and providing support services in incidents of forced labour, child labour, workplace violence and/or sexual assault, in the communities and districts where Better Cotton is grown, see Annex 1, for list of relevant districts). Support services of interest and relevance could include:, legal aid (with expertise on labour rights), financial services, return assistance (e.g. for migrant workers), rehabilitation, community-based child labour remediation support, crisis services, welfare support, counselling and advanced medical care (incl. fistula repair, access to emergency contraception, PEP and family planning support).

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Further inputs will be provided to the selected consultant to provide further background on the assignment, including:

- Decent Work taskforce report and recommendations (2020)
- Pakistan Decent Work Risk Assessment (2021)
- Pakistan Survivor Support Guidelines (2022)

Scope of Work

The two expected deliverables in this assignment are as follows:

- 1. A report mapping relevant state-based and non-state based, judicial and non-judicial grievance and remedy mechanisms with a detailed account of their scope, procedures and potential outcomes; as well as a high-level analysis of their alignment with core UNGP criteria of legitimacy, predictability, equitability, human rights compatibility, transparency, etc.
- 2. A list of credible entities (NGOs, Trade Unions, worker or other community organizations) supporting individuals in accessing remedy and/or providing support services in incidences of forced labour, child labour, violence and/or sexual assault, in the communities and districts where Better Cotton is grown (see Annex 1, for list of relevant districts), as well as a detailed description of support/service(s) provided, target population, impact to date, years of experience, main partners/donors (as relevant), specific location(s), and where possible, relevant contact details.
