What is a certification scheme?



A clearly defined framework that establishes criteria, processes and procedures that verify a product, process or system meets certain requirements.



Compliance is independently verified by a third-party certification body (a verifier not associated with Better Cotton)

Whereby



Certification bodies conducting conformity assessments are accredited to international standards or equivalents.



The scheme is credible, transparent and accessible.

Moving to a Certification Programme: framing and recap



The Empowering Consumers for the Green Transition Directive was adopted by the EU Council in March 2024, which aims to protect consumers from misleading product marketing information and 'greenwash'.

The directive will ban:

Vague or unsubstantiated sustainability claims such as: NET ZERO! SUSTAINABLE! EARTH CARBON NEUTRAL! FRIENDLY!

Sustainability labels not backed by an independent certification scheme or operated by a public authority.



Who are we certifying?





FARMERS

to ensure cotton is produced to deliver sustainability improvements at the field level



PRINCIPLES & CRITERIA

all farmers/production units assessed by certification bodies



SUPPLY CHAIN

to ensure chain of custody integrity is maintained for physical Chain of Custody models



CoC STANDARD

all supply chain organisations buying or selling Physical (Traceable) Better Cotton assessed by certification bodies



BRANDS

to ensure labels are only on products containing Physical (Traceable) Better Cotton



CoC STANDARD

all brands **using the BCI Content Label** on products for consumers assessed by certification bodies
